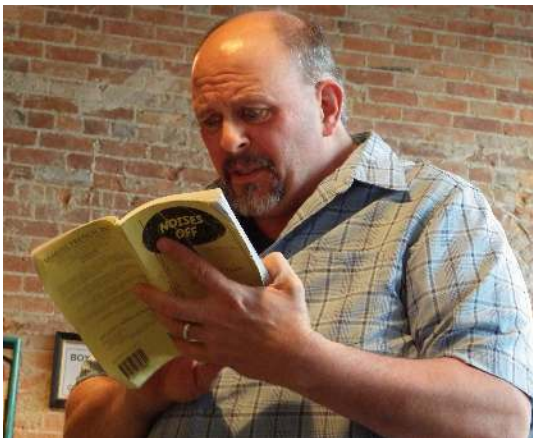

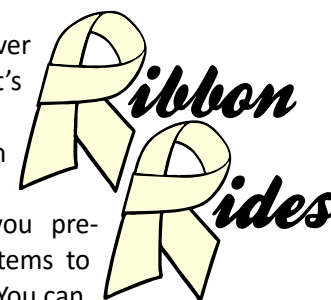

Really enjoying these spring days, have spring bulbs showing off their pretty colors and the trees in bloom so pretty. Love this time of year. Have lettuce up and spinach that I planted in flower pots, not ready to eat just yet but soon. This year I have planted green beans in a long planter box hope they do well. Last year I had them in flower bed and had quite a few to freeze, tasted might good last winter.

Still unhappy with some of the four legged critters or moles that have been eating well on the tulip bulbs. For my 80th birthday my brother sent me 80 tulip bulbs and I have about half of them gone. Not very happy with them critters.

I was looking back at some of my earlier letters I had written about gardening and could not believe my first article was written April 1 2006, 10 years ago, no wonder my brain is running out of something fresh to write. The Farmers Market had just started the year before. how fast time passes.

The first recipe was a vinegar and oil dressing that was served in the tea room at Wolfe and Dessauer. Remember that popular store in Fort Wayne? I sure do.

Vinegar and Oil Dressing 1 cup oil, 1 cup white vinegar, 1 cup sugar, 1 medium size onion finely dices, 1/2 tablespoon white pepper, 1/3 cup finely diced green pepper, 1/3 cup diced pimento or red pepper. Put vinegar, sugar and pepper and onion and green pepper in blender on high speed blend for about 1 minute reduce speed and slowly add oil. Add pimento last without blending. Keeps good for several days.

support students and keep them moving toward success, regardless of their path.”

The Indiana Commission for Higher Education and thirteen organizations from around the state contributed to the development of this Toolkit. It consists of lessons from the field that will help organizations create a program that works, select and prepare the right mentors to partner with students, and engage the community in the program. In addition, it provides practical steps to guide organizations through the process.

“Students need guidance, and knowing they have a mentor who cares and supports them eases the challenges they face day-to-day,” Indiana Commissioner for Higher Education Teresa Lubbers said. “Providing mentoring resources to youth-serving organizations is critically important to the development of effective mentors in our communities.”

This toolkit will provide a better understanding of what does and does not work when it comes to developing a postsecondary mentoring program for young people. It also will work seamlessly with the upcoming student version created by Project Leadership, a program based in Grant and Delaware counties that helps students access and succeed in college.

IYI will host a webinar on May 16 from 1 – 2:30 p.m. (EDT) to help program members better understand how both Toolkits can assist their organizations and ultimately students. IYI also

will feature the Toolkit during the Postsecondary Counseling Institute (PCI) presented by Kroger on June 16 and 17 in Indianapolis. To register for the webinar or PCI, visit the calendar section of www.iyi.org.

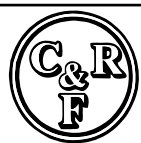

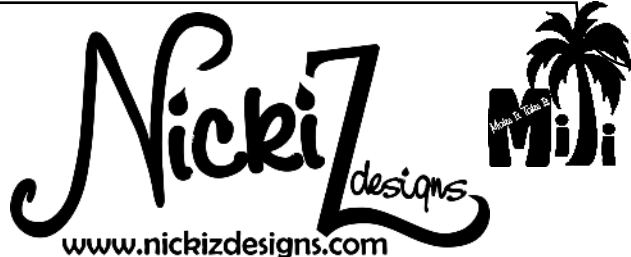

The Indiana BMV provides free, state-issued ID cards for voting purposes to any unlicensed Hoosier, as long as he or she can provide proper documentation and will be at least 18 years of age on or before the next General or Municipal Election. The following documents are required to obtain a new state ID card or driver's license (a complete list can be found at www.myBMV.com).

- * Proof of Identity document, such as a birth certificate or passport.

- * Proof of Social Security document, such as a Social Security card, pay stub or W-2.

- * Proof of lawful status, such as a birth certificate or passport.

- * Proof of residency, two documents such as a voter registration card, utility bill or bank statement.

All license branches will resume regular business hours on Wednesday, May 4.
