

BLOOD DRIVE

The American Red Cross has issued an emergency call for blood and platelets, urging all eligible donors to give to replenish extremely low summer blood supply.

Blood donations have fallen short of hospital needs for past few months, resulting in about 39,000 fewer donations than what's needed, as well as a significant draw down of the overall Red Cross blood supply. In addition, the Independence Day holiday may have caused many regular donors to postpone donations due to vacation plans. A recent Red Cross poll revealed that more than 75 percent of donors surveyed indicated vacation plans this summer, many of them occurring the weeks before and after July 4.

"Right now, blood products are being distributed to faster hospitals than donations are coming in, which is why we are making this emergency request for donations," said Rodney Wilson, communications manager of Red Cross Blood "Donations Services. urgently needed now to meet the needs of hospital patients in the coming days and weeks. If you've thought about giving blood and helping to save lives, now is the time to do it. It's the blood donations on the

Each week these bags contain a protein, typically a canned meat. In the past, both steers and hogs have been donated by 4-H auction buyers to be processed into canned beef and pork for these families in need. When an animal is donated, the cost of the processing is covered by Hoosiers Feeding the Hungry, a nonprofit organization dedicated to making a positive impact on the quality of lives of people within Indiana by providing nutritious meat.

This year we are encouraging 4-H auction buyers to create partnerships before the 4-H auction if they are interested in working together to support this worthy cause. It would take approximately 7 hogs and 2 steers to supply the backpack program with enough beef and pork for the entire school year. 
