### BLOOD DRIVE

The American Red Cross has issued an emergency call for blood and platelets, urging all eligible donors to give now to replenish an extremely low summer blood supply.

Blood donations have fallen short of hospital needs for the past few months, resulting in about 39,000 fewer donations than what's needed, as well as a significant draw down of the overall Red Cross blood supply. In addition, the Independence Day holiday may have caused many regular donors to postpone donations due to vacation plans. A recent Red Cross poll revealed that more than 75 percent of donors surveyed indicated vacation plans this summer, many of them occurring the weeks before and after July 4.

"Right now, blood products are being distributed to hospitals faster than donations are coming in, which is why we are making this emergency request for donations," said Rodney Wilson, communications manager of Red Cross Blood Services. "Donations are urgently needed now to meet the needs of hospital patients in the coming days and weeks. If you've thought about giving blood and helping to save lives, now is the time to do it. It's the blood donations on the

shelves that help save lives when an emergency occurs."

The next local Blood Drive will be held July 28, 2016 from 2-6pm at the Knight-Bergman Civic Center.

### TORCHBEARERS NAMED

Torchbearers for the Indiana Bicentennial Torch Relay in Huntington County have been selected. Twenty individuals were chosen by a committee, independent of the Bicentennial Committee, to accompany the Indiana Bicentennial Torch through

Huntington County on Friday, September 30.

The state of Indiana allowed Huntington County to have up to twenty Torchbearers and 37 nominations were submitted. The small committee choosing the twenty, evaluated each nomination form based on requirements and a scoring rubric provided by the state. The twenty selected were submitted to the state for approval. Three alternates were also selected in case there were any issues at the state level or a nominee declined the honor. All twenty nominees have accepted the honor of being a Torchbearer for the Bicentennial Torch Relay.

One of the two following criteria were required of a Torchbearer. Torchbearers must have achieved personal and/or professional excellence or celebrity status, or they may also have made an outstanding contribution to their neighborhood, community, region or state through service, stewardship and/or involvement.

Those selected as Torchbearers for Huntington County will accompany the Bicentennial Torch from Roanoke to Huntington's festivities at Hier's Park around 11 a.m. on September 30. The torch will then be handed off at the Wells County line in Markle.

Local Torchbearers include George Bergman who is deceased. Bergman was an active servant in the community of Warren,

**AUCTION HELPS KIDS**

Each year auction buyers at the Wells County 4-H Fair have the opportunity to support 4-H youth by buying their animals at the 4-H auction, but did you know that these buyers can also opt to donate that animal to the Feeding Tomorrow's Future Today Backpack Program which helps feed hungry kids?

Last year the backpack program sent 3,612 bags of food home with Wells County school children so they would have food for the weekend. This is an average of 103 bags every week.

Each week these bags contain a protein, typically a canned meat. In the past, both steers and hogs have been donated by 4-H auction buyers to be processed into canned beef and pork for these families in need. When an animal is donated, the cost of the processing is covered by Hoosiers Feeding the Hungry, a nonprofit organization dedicated to making a positive impact on the quality of lives of people within Indiana by providing nutritious meat.

This year we are encouraging 4-H auction buyers to create partnerships before the 4-H auction if they are interested in working together to support this worthy cause. It would take approximately 7 hogs and 2 steers to supply the backpack program with enough beef and pork for the entire school year. If you are a buyer that is interested in donating your 4-H Auction purchase of a hog or steer to the Feeding Tomorrow's Future Today Backpack Program, please mention this on the day of the 4-H auction, July 21, at auction check in and they will assist you.
