### FESTIVAL CANCELLED

Following discussion between the Warren Town Council and Officers of the Salamonie Summer Festival Committee, it was determined that the 2020 FINAL FRIDAY'S 2020 Festival be cancelled including the Fireworks and Parade. While it was not a easy decision, due to the uncertainty of the current COVID situation and related issues, and after checking with over twenty five other communities, and after requesting input from some local citizens, and after checking with consultants among other issues, it was decided that it was not in the best interest of Warren Area Citizens to hold events in which social distancing would or could not be possible or be able to be controlled. Town Officials applaud the committee for their work in planning the event and are annual encouraged about some alternate planning that might be put in place by the committee later in the year. Again, please realize it was not an easy decision to make and disappointment is being felt by all. The Miss Warren pageant will continue as it is being held in a private setting and since those chosen represent community in many other ways than just during the Festival. The Samuel Jones Pioneer Event has also been canceled.

We all hope that with the grassy area of the park to announcement being made now, you will have time to plan a July 4th Celebration Weekend.

Families who do not adding spring apparel to your currently receive SNAP will receive an electronic benefits transfer card in the appointments mail by the end of May, along with instructions on how to activate and use their card. Families do not have to apply for Pandemic EBT, also called "P-EBT." The P-EBT card works like a bank debit card and can be used at any store in the United States that accepts SNAP, but cannot be used for cash withdrawals at ATM machines. FSSA worked with the Indiana Department of Education to identify these families based upon their child already receiving free and reduced-cost meals at school.

> Families who already receive SNAP benefits will have the additional benefits applied to their SNAP accounts on their Hoosier Works EBT card by the end of May.

#### FROM L.A.C.E.

Alcohol is the most frequently used substance in Indiana and the United States. Excessive alcohol consumption contributes to a number of health and economic consequences. Prolonged and compulsive use of alcohol can also lead to alcohol use disorder.

The Indiana Epidemiological Profile for 2019 was recently released. Notable statistics are as follows:

- Over half of the population ages 12 and older consumed alcohol within the past month.
- The rate of underage drinking in Indiana among 12to 17-year-olds was 9.3%.
- In 2018, nearly onefourth of Indiana residents ages 12 or older reported binge drinking. The highest rate was among 18- to 25vear-olds. Health officials define binge drinking as having enough alcohol to bring your blood-alcohol content up to the legal limit for driving, about five drinks for men or four drinks for women in less than 2 hours.
- The Indiana Youth Survey indicates that in 2018, 29.5% of Indiana 12th grade students reported using alcohol at least once during the past 30 days. Overall, consumption alcohol patterns seemed to progress with age; i.e., 8th grade

were recorded in Indiana schools related to alcohol.

There are many conditions that are directly attributable to alcohol. Those conditions that may not be as obvious include: homicide 47%; fire injuries 42%; hypothermia 42%; portal hypertension 40%; drowning 34%; fall injuries 32%; poisoning (not alcohol) 29%; acute pancreatitis 24%; and suicide 23%.

These numbers suggest that problematic alcohol continues to plague various age groups in our society. Unfortunately, denial is a common trait among those struggling with alcohol use disorders. They often underestimate the amount they drink, the duration of their drinking problem, and the impact it has on their life, or overestimate their ability to control their drinking or to quit. Denial is also common

## **HOMELAND FOUNDATION** SCHOLARSHIPS OPEN

Indiana college students who volunteer with a public safety organization can now apply for the FY 2021 round of the Indiana Homeland Security Foundation scholarship.

The Indiana Homeland Security Foundation scholarship offers higher education financial assistance for Indiana students who wish to pursue a degree.

A full-time student with at least 12 credit hours per semester is eligible for a \$2,000 scholarship and a parttime student with at least six per semester is eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship. The scholarship must be used during the awarded school year, and the funds are intended solely to reimburse eligible student educational expenses.

Eligible applicants include Indiana residents who are an incoming or continuing student who:

Attends or will be attending an accredited Indiana college. Must have a grade point average of 2.8 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

Volunteers at a public safety organization such as fire, law enforcement, emergency management or emergency medical services (validated by chief executive). 

### **BAD TIMES AND DEPRESSION**

from the American **Counseling Association** Even in the best of times, depression is a major mental health issue. Recent statistics find more than 17 million Americans are affected by The DNR is asking paddlers to major depressive disorders in any given year. And in today's period of pandemics, Indiana waterways from June social distancing and wide-

spread uncertainty about financial and health issues, not surprising that depression is a growing problem.

Major depressive disorder is, however, more than simply feelings of sadness or grief.

We all have times when things aren't going quite right and the results leave us unhappy. Our sadness might be triggered by anything from problems at work to the grief brought on by the loss of someone dear to you.

The difference between that type of unhappiness and major depression is both the severity of what is being experienced and the fact that lasting. Simple long sadness over life circumstances normally fades within a couple of weeks, but major depression is deeper and much longer lasting. Major depression doesn't just have you feeling blue but it's a mental health illness that can directly affect your life in a number of negative ways.

Major depressive disorder can be recognized through the wide range of symptoms that often come with it. In addition to feeling sad and being in a depressed mood, major depression will often affect sleep patterns, making sleeping difficult or having someone sleep too much. Some people have little energy and feel fatigued
