LEAD POISONING PREVENTION

(Editor's Note: This didn't get here in time for last week's edition but I feel it still has pertinent information in it.)

The Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) highlights the need for all Hoosier children younger than age 7 to be screened for lead exposure during National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week, recognized Oct. 22-28.

Beginning Jan. 1, 2023, House Enrolled Act 1313 requires that all Indiana healthcare providers determine whether children age 6 and younger have been tested for lead poisoning and to offer screening. Through August 2023, there has been a 21% increase in unique children tested compared to the same period in 2022 and a 393% overall increase in confirmed cases of elevated

I love German food and no better time than Octoberfest to have all that delicious food. I get it honestly cause 75 percent of my family is German and it really shows. The way we walk, talk and of course our facial features shine through and if anyone knew my dad he was definitely a German through and through. So I celebrate my heritage every chance I get and fix us some German cuisine.

I'll share with you a favorite

SAUSAGE WITH APPLE KRAUT

- 1 med. Onion, sliced
- 3 tbsp. Butter
- 2 med. Apples peeled and shredded
- 1 tbsp. Lemon juice
- 1-14 oz can kraut rinsed and drained
- 1/2c. Unsweetened apple juice
- 1tsp caraway seeds
- 1/2 tsp fennel seeds, crushed
- 1# Polska kielbasa sausage

In large Skillet sauté onions in Butter 15 minutes or till lightly browned. In a bowl, toss apples with lemon juice. Add apples, kraut, apple juice, caraway and fennel seeds to the onion, bring to a boil. Reduce heat and cover and simmer 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, cut sausage into 1/4 inch slices and cook according to package directions and add to kraut mixture. Heat till hot.

blood lead levels. This has led to 81.9% more children receiving resources and support from lead case managers than in all of 2022.

“Lead poisoning can look like a lot of other things like attention deficit disorder, ADHD or even autism because it doesn’t present in a specific way,” said Paul Krievins, director of the Indiana Department of Health Lead and Healthy Homes Division. “Testing is critical to identifying and removing sources of lead and ensuring children exposed to lead receive needed care and treatment.”

Data show that no amount of lead in the blood is safe, and children age 6 and younger are most vulnerable to the effects of lead exposure because their bodies use the toxic lead in brain and bone development. Young children are also more likely to be exposed to lead through placing their hands which may be contaminated by lead dust into their mouths. Lead dust often originates from deteriorated lead-based paint in older homes, but lead can occur naturally in soil and can be found in drinking water fed through lead pipes. Signs of lead exposure can include damage to the brain and nervous system, learning and behavior problems, developmental delays and hearing and speech problems.

Afterwards, somehow I made it up the three steps and onto a horse-drawn, taxi/buggy for a tour of the island. We were informed that the functioning Post Office does not make home deliveries; a June Lilac Festival is popular; 500-600 people are year round residents, and a school houses several students. The tour included a ride through the Mackinac Island State Park. 600 horses have summer duty here, but most winter in the Upper Peninsula.

I learned that the island and the Great Lakes were formed about 20,000 years ago as an aftermath of the Ice Age/glacier melt. By 1,000 AD, the Native Americans, Anishinaabek (Odawa, Ojibway, & Potawatomi) inhabited the island. They called it: the place of the great turtle, due to the character of the white bluffs. The island's name was shortened from Michilimackinac.

Claude Dablon and Jacques Marquette established the first settlement in 1671. It became an early fur trading location and later an important military post. The island was occupied at various times by the French, British, and USA. During the Revolutionary War, the British thought that Fort Michilimackinac was too vulnerable on the mainland, and built Fort Mackinac on the island in 1781.

The island's circumference was 8 miles. Bicycles were in abundance! It took one hour to travel that distance by pedaling; however, walking required 2.5-4 hours. We declined both options. The Jewel golf course was associated with the Grand Hotel. The Wawashkamo (Wawa) course is the only one in the USA to be built on a former battlefield (War of 1812-14). The governor has a summer home here.

After touring the Butterfly Conservatory, we enjoyed a six-station buffet at the Grand Hotel. The 660 foot long front porch was a

spectacular resting spot before slowly walking the mile route back to the Bicycle Street Inn & Suites. It was 3:10 pm. when we reached that destination. A two hour relaxation period was deserved and taken.

Although shopping is not a high priority for us, we forced ourselves to explore a few shops on Main Street while looking for a meal source. A pre-wrapped turkey/cheese sandwich and a pickled carrots packet were chosen. After devouring these choices in the hotel room, it was decided to return to that store for duplicates. That fulfilled the next day's lunch-on-our-own necessity.

Lights out.
