**ANNUAL MEETING**

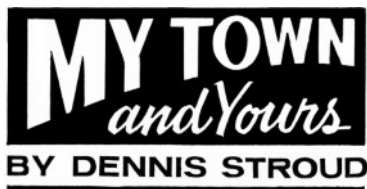
Huntington County Extension will hold its Annual Meeting on Monday, November 15. The meeting will be held in First Merchants Bank Heritage Hall at the Huntington County Fair Grounds, 631 E Taylor Street. The meeting will begin at 6 p.m. with a light meal.

A short business meeting will be first on the docket followed by success stories shared by Purdue Extension

staff. The meeting will feature local representatives from the Center for Energy Education. They will discuss the Midwest energy transition and their work in community renewable energy education.

**GAL-VA**

The Warren Businessmen, in 1919, bought a factory site along the railroad at the end of west 4th street. They built a 40 by 100 building and lured Mr. Locke and his factory to Warren from Fort Wayne. The company was called The Galva Manufacturing Company. The company made wood clothes racks, wash machines, wash boards and other wooden articles.

In September 1919, there was a new room added and E. M. Mossburg became the sole owner of the place. There was a good demand for wash boards and washing machines, but since the factory was started it was difficult to get workmen and materials because of a nation-wide scarcity of both. The name was changed to The Warren Manufacturing Company.

In the early 20's, there was a growing demand for the wooden handy-dandy washing machines. In June a steady run was made for twenty-four days and 1000 washing machines were finished in that time. But, at that time shipping conditions, due to a railroad strike, made it difficult to get raw materials and ship the finished product. I do have one in the museum.

The word 'doctor' literally means 'teacher.'"
