FOURTH OF JULY MEMORIES - YANKEE DOODLE DANDY

Two former presidents of the United States and signers of the Declaration of Independence died on July 4th, 1826. John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, once opponents and later friendly correspondents, died on the 50th anniversary of the signing of this historic document. Adams' reported last words were "Thomas Jefferson survives." However, Jefferson had preceded Adams in death a few hours earlier.

Another patriot associated with the Fourth of July was showman George M. Cohan, whose life was celebrated in the movie, "Yankee Doodle Dandy" starring James Cagney.

Said to have been born on the Fourth of July, Cohan penned a legacy of patriotic songs that were the basis for many Broadway musicals. They included tunes such as "You're a Grand Old Flag," "I'm a Yankee Doodle Dandy," and "Over There." "Over There" was recorded by Nora Bayes, became a national hit, and was the most popular song of World War I.

Written just as America was entering the first world war, the words called to the troops and the families they left behind.

"So prepare, say a prayer,
 Send the word, send the word to beware.
 We'll be over, we're coming over
 And we won't come back
 Till its over over there."

Twenty-five years later Congress authorized President Franklin Delano Roosevelt to name Cohan a Congressional Gold Medal recipient for this stirring song.

The good news: You have inherited six million dollars from an uncle you never met. The bad news: You have to take your dead uncle to Monte Carlo for a final vacation or you lose the money to the Universal Dog Home of Brooklyn. This pre-

Those who already have Prescription Drug coverage through their employer or retirement plan may not want, nor need, this coverage. People who have both Medicare & Medicaid will be automatically enrolled in a plan!

As with any Insurance plan, there will be Premiums, Deductibles and Copays. For now, the important thing to do is to become informed about the program and whether or not you should choose to enroll in a plan. If you are a Medicare beneficiary with limited income and

resources, you may be able to get extra help paying for prescription drugs under this program. You will need to apply to Social Security to see if you qualify for help paying for your monthly premiums, deductibles and co-payments under this new prescription drug program. The Social Security office in Wilkes Barre, PA has mailed out millions of applications to Medicare recipients, which it believes might qualify for extra help. If you have received an application and think you might qualify for this assistance, you MUST fill out the 5 pages & 16 questions and SEND it in. This DOES NOT enroll you in a Medicare Part D program. It will only allow you to know if you qualify for help paying for your monthly premiums, deductibles and co-

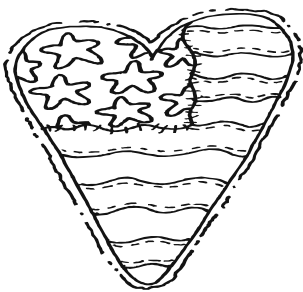
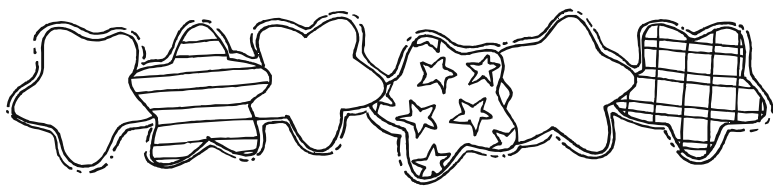

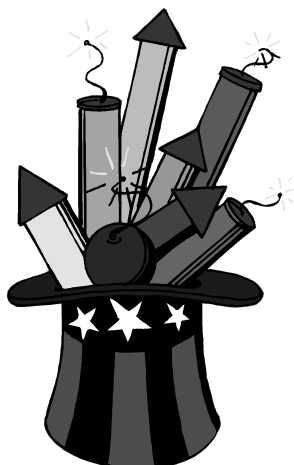
