FOURTH OF JULY MEMORIES - YANKEE DOODLE DANDY

Two former presidents of the United States and signers of the Declaration of Independence died on July 4th, 1826. John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, once opponents and later friendly correspondents, died on the 50th anniversary of the signing of this historic document. Adams' reported last words were "Thomas Jefferson survives." However, Jefferson had preceded Adams in death a few hours earlier.

Another patriot associated with the Fourth of July was showman George M. Cohan, whose life was celebrated in the movie, "Yankee Doodle Dandy" starring James Cagney.

Said to have been born on the Fourth of July, Cohan penned a legacy of patriotic songs that were the basis for many Broadway musicals. They included tunes such as "You're a Grand Old Flag;" "I'm a Yankee Doodle Dandy;' and "Over There." "Over There" was recorded by Nora Bayes, became a national hit, and was the most popular song of World War I.

Written just as America was entering the first world war, the words called to the troops and the families they left behind.

"So prepare, say a prayer,

Send the word, send the word to beware.

We'll be over, we're coming over

And we won't come back

Till its over over there."

Twenty-five years later Congress authorized President Franklin Delano Roosevelt to name Cohan a Congressional Gold Medal recipient for this stirring song.


3 c picked and cleaned gooseberries (not a very fun job, but worth it)
