# STEPDADS ARE DOING A GOOD JOB

Since the number of stepfamilies appears to be growing with each passing year, researchers at the University of Maryland in College Park, wanted to know if a stepfather can be as good a parent as a biological dad. They found that the answer is yes.

When they interviewed stepfathers on how they treated their biological children and their stepchildren (up to age 12), the answers were very positive. Researchers inquired about qualities they used to measure the father's involvement.

When it came to how much affection these dads showed the kids, how much they praised them, and how much time they spent with them, they found that fathers were just as focused on their stepchildren as their

The doctors conclude that stepfathers can be very good dads.

# KIDS TURN ON TO INSTANT MESSAGING

More young people are using Internet instant messaging to keep in touch with friends. They talk to several people at once.

The short messages fly back and forth on the computer screen as preteens and teens use the Internet to visit. According to one survey, . 77 percent of 9- to 12-year-olds have Internet access. That number rises to 83 percent for 12- to 17 -year-olds.

Experts say parents need to keep an eye on them. Kids don't always know who is talking back when they chat on line. They should be warned "not to talk to strangers" on line as well as in person. Parents should make it a point to know what abbreviations mean, like "bbfn" (bye-bye for now). At Cyberpatrol, a parental software company, they say parents should ask what an unknown acronym means. And they suggest that kids use a code or salutation that only friends know. They should be warned not to give out phone numbers or personal informa-

# TMM TH TIPS

Q. SHOULD WOMEN BE MORE CONCERNED
ABOUT GUM DISEASE??

A. As a woman goes through different phases of her life there is the potential for a greater risk or periodontal (gum) disease. From the onset, through teenage years, pregnancy and menopause, a woman's hormone changes can affect her oral health. The reason is that hormones alter the bacteria (plaque) that make their home in the mouth. Irritants or changes in the bacteria can make the gums swell and bleed (ex. pregnancy gingivitis). As the disease progresses, this can lead to further breakdown, pocket formation and the starting place for periodontal disease. This can lead to bone loss, which can severely loosen teeth, cause pain, and eventuallytooth loss. Other contributions to gum disease are smoking and diabetes. Gum disease is preventable. However, the "old wives tale" of losing a tooth for every pregnancy or the baby took all the calcium out of my teeth is simply not true. Regular brushing, flossing and trips to the dentist can reduce your chances of getting gum disease. Another concern is crash dieting. Crash diets can affect the production of saliva in your mouth. Saliva is vital to your mouth's ability to cleanse itself. cluded piano solos, duets and a violin solo.


