As Mr. Rogers said on the kids tv program, it is a lovely day in our neighborhood. The grass is growing flowers blooming and all is looking lovely. Although my neighbor Mr. Wilson said his chicken quit laying eggs. I told him to give them some egg laying feed and more exercise. They seem to just want to hang out under the shade tree.

When I was a kid at home if the old hen didn't produce she was bound for the stew pot. Those chicken and noodles on Sunday dinner was mighty tasty.

We had an ole rooster one time that every morning would be outside our bedroom window crowing starting at the break of dawn. My sister got tired of it and one morning she raised the window and threw her shoe at him and was a perfect hit, got him in the head and fell over dead. She thought she would surely be in trouble, but my dad was coming from the barn with the milk and saw it all. Went in the house and told mom funny thing happened the rooster just fell over dead in the yard. She hurried out to get it and butcher it and the story fell apart when she seen the shoe beside the dead rooster. Poor dad thought he had saved our sole till then. Two girls got their fanny out of bed real quick with orders to help dress out the poor critter. Actually my dad thought it was pretty funny seeing the shoe flying out the upstairs window.

We could always count on dad being on our side. If the time came for a correction it was always stern but kind and we knew exactly how to behave and accept being corrected. Just another memory from way back that we still laugh about.

My mom made hundreds of pounds of noodles and sold them to stores and to people who came to the house to buy. She didn't have a recipe but she started with usually a dozen egg yolks and half dozen whole eggs and added enough flour to make the dough where it could be rolled out, the table would be pulled out as much as possible and often some card tables set up. When dried to just right she cut them all by hand with her special knife and would slice them so very thin and each was very accurate. Mine don't look quite that good and I have tried to compare mine with hers.

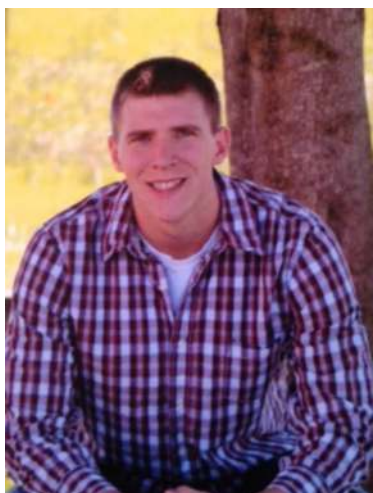

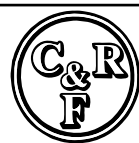

▪ Shred receipts, bank statements and unused credit card offers before throwing them away.

▪ Carefully choose a trustworthy person to act as your agent in all estate-planning matters.

▪ Lock up your checkbook, account statements & other sensitive information when others will be in your home.

▪ Order copies of your credit report once a year to ensure accuracy.

▪ Never give personal information, including Social Security Number, account number or other financial information to anyone over the phone unless you initiated

the call and the other party is trusted.

▪ Never pay a fee or taxes to collect sweepstakes or lottery "winnings."

▪ Never rush into a financial decision. Ask for details in writing and get a second opinion.
