miles away from the peninsula port at Catawba, OH. We passed the Back Water Marina, but still no lake water in sight.

At the dock office, we paid the \$16 Miller Ferry fee for the 18 minute boat ride to the island of Put-in-Bay.

Motorized vehicles and bicycles were boarded first.

Passengers were next.

Rather than climbing the multiple stair steps to the upper level, we located a corner at the stern of the gasoline-powered vessel and watched the bubbles and waves generated by the ferry's engine and the bow respectively. After the vessel docked at the Miller Boat Line's Lime Kiln Dock, we walked slowly up the long, concrete ramp to Langram Street where a white, Lime Kiln Bus was patiently waiting. It ushered us the two miles to the downtown area after paying the driver a \$3 fee. He admitted that he was a snow bird.

After inquiring about a golf cart rental, we decided to browse the local area and not motor elsewhere on the 397 acre island. Slowly, we walked two blocks on a boardwalk to Mossbacks Island Bar & Grill after checking the Island Guide. Soup & sandwich suited us. I added a local, Rhinegeist beverage. My wife bought a Put-in-Bay T-shirt at the Surf Shop next door to prove that we actually arrived. Then our slow walk took us past the adjacent Fish Bowl clothing store, the Reel Bar, the Round House Bar, & the Mojito Bay Tiki Bar. Yes, there are 25 bars here. Reportedly, they are very busy, but not today as their season is winding down.

We picked the ideal day to visit. It was 75 degrees, sunny, and featured a slight breeze. We did take a walk through the Beer Barrel Saloon. It is distinguished by the fact that it houses the "World's Largest (longest) Bar" structure. It measures 405 feet in length. Live music and buffet meals are advertised. This facility was

originally named the Colonial Bar and was destroyed by fire in 1988. I have a history in this building. Not the bar scene! Several years ago, my first wife and I traveled there on a whim. Unexpectedly, we discovered that a musical group with which we were acquainted was performing that evening at this facility. I believe that their group name was "Morningstar." So we decided to stay another day in Port Clinton on the mainland and returned to the island that evening to listen to their music.

Before leaving the island today, we walked another block to the eastern shore via Delaware Street. After resting on a bench and picking up small rocks which had washed upon the beach, we took photos of the nearby, Perry's Victory and International Peace Memorial. This 352 foot, tall structure was built in 1912-15 as a tribute to Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry who voiced the phrase, "Don't Give Up The Ship" during the 1812 Battle of Lake Erie. He is credited with chasing the British back to England. The battle took place near South Bass Island which is better known as Put-in-Bay Island.

After returning to the mainland, passing Herb's Beer & Bait Shop, traveling through the town of Port Clinton, we headed south on Highway # 53 again. Located Highway # 12 and followed it through Fostoria and Findlay, OH. The latter featured a colorful water tower with large lettering, "Findlay Salutes Veterans." Our vehicle joined I-75 to Lima where Highway # 81 angled west to the Indiana border. This road changed numbers to Indiana Highway # 124 which led us home. Our return trip lasted longer than the morning route, but we stopped for ice cream cones at J B Twisters in Ohio which helped greatly!

Alice was beloved by family and many friends. She greeted everyone with a smile and seemed to know everyone in Huntington County. She will be deeply missed.

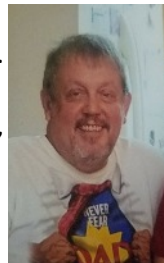

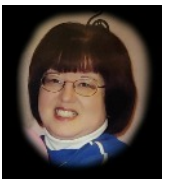

EARN INTERNSHIP GRANT

Work and Learn Indiana is requesting applications from schools for the newly-launched Employment Aid Readiness Network (EARN) Indiana grant for high school students.

Through Work and Learn Indiana, the state of Indiana has expanded its partnership with the Indiana Chamber of Commerce to match students and employers to EARN-eligible work-based learning opportunities. Previously, EARN has been limited to college-age students.

EARN Indiana was created to ensure students with financial need have equitable access to resume-building, experiential, paid internship opportunities. In return for hiring low-income Hoosier students and

meeting program quality standards, Indiana employers receive state matching funds that reimburse up to 50% of the student's hourly wages.

"Since its inception in 2013, the EARN Indiana program has provided nearly 8,000 internship positions to eligible Hoosier students," relays Indiana Commissioner for Higher Education Teresa Lubbers. "Expanding the program eligibility to high school students will allow them to explore future career pathways through high-quality, paid internships with employers in their communities."

In preparation for the statewide expansion, the Indiana Department of Education, Indiana Commission for Higher Education and Indiana Chamber are seeking applications from Hoosier school communities for a \$1 million pilot grant opportunity in partnership with area employers.

The pilot grants aim to build local capacity to connecting high school students with high-quality internship/pre-apprenticeship experiences beginning in summer 2022 and continuing through the 2022-23 academic school year. Up to 10 schools will be chosen for the pilot.

tolerate and we kept rice bread for them when they wanted it. Nowadays we have all sorts of goodies, breads, buns, cookies and we provide a lot of options for hot foods. Times have changed and thank goodness for those who suffer from this.

I took a recipe to the state fair this year and competed in the dietary restrictions class. I think these are a great cookie and very tasty with no flour in them. I was completely surprised and they are sure to fix the chocolate craving too. I hope this recipe helps those who are looking for good things to eat gluten free and of course you don’t have to be gluten free to enjoy them.

### FLOUR-LESS CHOCOLATE-WALNUT COOKIES

- 2 ¾ c. walnut halves
- 3 c. powdered sugar
- 1/2c. unsweetened Dutch cocoa, plus
- 3 T. unsweetened Dutch cocoa
- ½ tsp. salt
- 4 egg whites, at room temp
- 1 T. pure vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spread walnuts on a large rimmed baking sheet and toast in oven for 9 minutes or until they are golden and fragrant. Let cool slightly. Then transfer to work surface and coarsely chop them.

Position two racks in the upper and the lower thirds of the oven and lower temperature to 320 degrees and line two large rimmed baking sheets with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, whisk or combine in an electric mixer on low speed the powdered sugar with the cocoa powder and the salt followed by the walnuts. While mixing add the egg whites and vanilla and beat just until the batter is moistened, do not over beat or it will stiffen.

Spoon the batter onto the baking sheets in 12 evenly spaced mounds and bake for 14 to 16 minutes or until the tops are glossy and lightly cracked and shift the pans from front to back to ensure even baking at approximately 7 minutes. Slide the parchment paper off on to cooling racks and let cookies cool completely. You can store cookies in a container for up to 3 days.
