LEADERSHIP CLASS

Huntington County Adult Leadership is partnering with Purdue Extension to bring a Community Leadership Huntington program to The intent is to County. encourage more people to get leadership involved in opportunities that will help make Huntington County a better place to live, work and play. The Feb. 2nd, 2016 HCL Course was facilitated by Heather Strohm. Heather is a Regional Community Development Educator for Purdue Extension. Prior to the course, the HCL students were instructed to gather facts about Huntington County that helped shape the area and helped to put it on the map. The students used the first half of the course to peg these facts onto a timeline to create a visual piece of how the grown county has progressed over the years. The students then came up with a list of how they would to see the county continue to grow in the years to come and also identified some of the road blocks that potentially be hindrance if they are not addressed.

Huntington County Leadership Class met for the 3rd time Tuesday morning, Feb 9th, 2016. The topic of this class focused on "Leading Through Interpersonal Communication" with exercises that built skills and understanding for how we listen, how we speak, and how we give and receive feedback. We worked in groups of 3 to brainstorm the barriers to good listening included good listening skills and then Aimee Lunsford Principal of shared all our ideas as a Flint Springs, be a good speaker, barriers to speaking, and how to practice Crestview. The facilitator was being a better speaker. We also talked about Huntington Strengths, County's Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats to the growth and future of the county. We all took pictures of different places in the county that represents the strengths and weaknesses of the county and what we could do to turn the weaknesses into opportunities and then strengths. As we closed out the meeting, we talked about which community projects we want to work on to put our leadership skills into action to serve and help our local community and the county as a whole.

Participating fish & wildlife areas are: Atterbury, Chinook, Crosley, Deer Creek, Fairbanks Landing, Glendale, Goose Pond, Hillenbrand, Hovey Jasper-Pulaski, Kankakee, Kingsbury, LaSalle, Pigeon River, Roush Lake, Tri-County, Ridge, Sugar Wabashiki, Willow Slough and Winamac.

Mississinewa and Salamonie lakes also are participating.

A limit will be placed on the number of youth hunters allowed to hunt a property on each hunting day. Registration begins March 21 and runs

hunters or an adult representing them must register in person or by phone during the normal office hours for the property they wish to hunt. Hunters are allowed to register for only one property.

Those wanting to sign up for hunts may do so at Deer Creek FWA. Those wanting to sign up for Fairbanks Landing or Hillenbrand hunts may do so at Goose Pond FWA.

At properties where the exceeds the spots available, a drawing will be held on April 4. A youth hunter may be drawn for either or both hunt days, depending on the number of applicants. All applicants will be notified of drawing results by mail.

Applicants must possess a youth consolidated 2016 hunting & trapping license, a 2016 non-resident youth spring turkey license with a game bird habitat stamp privilege. or а lifetime comprehensive hunting license. Apprentice hunting licenses of the types named above also may be used.

To register a youth for one of hunts, the following information is needed:

- -Hunter's name
- —Type of license and license number
- Date(s) for which applying
- —Mailing address
- -Phone number
- Parent or guardian's name, address and phone number.

Hunts will be conducted onehalf hour before sunrise until noon at properties in the Central Time Zone, and onehalf hour before sunrise until 1 p.m. on properties in the Eastern Time Zone.

Youth hunters who are selected for the hunt may check in at any time each day until the end of legal hunting

through April 1. Interested hours for that property. Monday, March 14, from 6 to Properties will not have a daily "no-show" drawing. Hunters interested in possible 1945 unfilled quotas at a property Huntington. This should phone that property for more information before showing up.

During youth wild turkey the Chinook or Wabashiki season, hunters younger than age 18 on the day of the hunt can take a bearded or male wild turkey. The youth must be accompanied by someone 18 or older.

The youth hunter may use number of registered hunters any legal shotgun, bow and arrow or crossbow. The adult accompanying the youth hunter must not possess a firearm, bow and arrow or crossbow while in the field. The adult does not need to possess a turkey hunting license unless the youth is using an apprentice license, or offered on Tuesday, March 22, unless the adult is calling turkeys.


