## MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

Opens at the Pulse July 8

April 23, 2016 marked the 400th anniversary of William Shakespeare's death. To mark the occasion, three quarters of a billion people worldwide are celebrating his life through music, dance, art and, of course, his plays. The Pulse Opera House is proud to join in the celebration with the summer production of A Midsummer Night's Dream.

A Midsummer Night's Dream is about love. Romantic and magical, this show speaks to young and old alike. If Shakespeare couldn't come up with a word, he made one up. He is credited with inventing 1,700 words, most of which are used to this day.

Shakespeare understood relationships, such as the excitement of young love, friendships torn apart by jealousy and the ups and downs of mature relationships. Most of all, Shakespeare is just plain fun.

Three story lines run throughout the play. The first story concerns the mortals, including a Duke and Queen who are preparing to be married. There are two pair of young lovers who are pulled apart by a demanding father and an arranged marriage.

The second concerns the inhabitants of an enchanted forest. Oberon and Titania, the King and Queen, are having a fight, which causes storms, famine and sickness. Puck is a hobgoblin who loves playing pranks. The language in these scenes is highly poetical and is like listening to music.

The third story is about a group of workers (the mechanicals) from the village who are meeting to rehearse a play. They have more enthusiasm than talent. The mechanicals speak in language that is easily understood.

They all meet in the forest on an enchanted midsummer evening. Misunderstandings, pranks, love potions, fights and storms combine for comic chaos. Featuring original music by Mark Turney and a set that is a magical playground by Ron Wartzok, this show has a little something for all ages!

### OPEN ENROLLMENT

Small World Preschool in Warren is a non-profit preschool, which has been serving the families of Warren and the surrounding area for over thirty years.

Small World is now registering students for the 2016-2017 school year.

Classes begin in early September and end in early May. The 3-4 year old class attends on Tuesday and Thursday from 9-11:30 and the 4-5 year old class attends on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9-11:30 am or 12:30-3:00 pm, if the morning class fills up and there are at least 8 children signed up for the afternoon class. Children must be 3 or 4 years old by August 1, 2016.

The cost is \$70 a month for the 3-4 year old class (\$560 total) and \$85.00 a month for the 4-5 year old class (\$680

total), with a \$40 application fee. The registration fee increases to \$50 after June 30th and registration ends July 31. Scholarships are available to qualifying families.

### COMMUNITY GARDEN

The Helping Hands Community Garden opened for harvest on Saturday, June 25!

All are welcome! We are seeking to provide fresh, wholesome, locally grown produce to those in our community who have limited access to it. This season, garden harvest times will be Mondays from 4-6pm, Wednesdays from 10am-12pm, and Saturdays from 10am-12pm. Community members and those who harvest from the garden are asked to work during

designated harvest times or by scheduling another time with Purdue Extension.

We now have kale, Swiss chard, spinach, and yellow summer squash ready for harvest, soon to be followed by broccoli and kohlrabi. We have also planted beets, green beans, zucchini squash, cabbage, lettuce, herbs, okra, red potatoes, onions, several varieties of tomatoes, peppers, and winter squash, etc.

The garden is located next to Huntington North High School on Viking Lane near the intersection with Jefferson Street. Staff from the Huntington County Purdue Extension office are available during the week to help harvest, work to maintain the garden and provide nutrition education lessons.

We would like to thank members of the College Park UB Church, staff from the Department of Child Services and other individuals for 'Adopting a Week' at the garden. There are other faithful volunteers who work hard to help plant and

maintain the garden and prepare it for harvest. Place half bread in oiled 9x13 bake dish top with cream cheese and blueberries then add remaining bread cubes, beat eggs,syrup and milk together pour evenly over bread cover and refrigerate overnite bake covered with foil 30 minutes at 350 remove foil and bake 10 minutes longer or until top is golden brown, serve with more syrup if desired and top with whipped cream or cool whip.

Fireworks may only be set off on the user's property, on the property of someone who has consented to the use of fireworks or at locally-mandated special discharge locations. Not all communities designate a special discharge location.

Throughout the year, fireworks may only be used between 9 a.m. and 11 p.m. Local ordinance may limit this further.

No local limitations may be placed on holidays and specially designated days listed below.

Specially designated days for fireworks use are June 29 through July 3 and July 5 through 9. On those days, fireworks may be used between 9 a.m. until two hours after sunset.

On holidays (Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and New Year's Eve), fireworks may be used between 9 a.m. and midnight.

There are penalties that come with breaking the laws regarding fireworks. Here are a few examples:

A person using fireworks anywhere other than the three previously listed places could face a maximum fine of \$500 per infraction.

Damaging someone else's property with fireworks could result in a fine of \$5,000 as well as one year imprisonment. Restitution costs to the property owner may also be assessed.

Someone recklessly, knowingly, or intentionally using fireworks and causing the serious injury or death of someone else could face imprisonment and a maximum fine of \$10,000.

Anyone under the age of 18 possessing or using fireworks without the presence of an adult could face a fine of \$500 per infraction.

Not only do fireworks users need to abide by laws, but so do fireworks retailers who sell to the public, who may only sell 1.4G consumer fireworks. Dealers must hold a permit through Indiana Department of Homeland Security's Fire and Building Safety Division, which is overseen by the State Fire Marshal.

No one younger than 18 may purchase fireworks.
