**A BUS TRIP TO HHI, SAVANNAH, & CHARLESTON DAY # 5, PART 1**

A bus tour of Savannah, Georgia was the planned excursion for the day. We left the hotel at 8:16 am., one minute late due to my rushing back inside and playing detective to retrieve

a medication for a potential need. Our group was finally on the road again, crossing those bridges back to the mainland. While heading west on the Bluffton Parkway, we watched a DVD about the Gullah community of Pin Point, GA. The film noted that Justice Clarence Thomas and the "Hinder Me Not Church" were part of that culture.

The bus route traveled on May River Road, Highway 46 East, and Highway 315 South. I was lost! I felt much more comfortable when we passed the "Sweet Potato Kitchen" restaurant and turned south on US Highway 17 toward Savannah.

The next eatery that we skipped past was "The Crab Shack." Those names identified real southern living!

Half way across the Savannah River Bridge, it was reported that we were now in Georgia. The first building that came into view was a BMW assembly plant. The next offering was several signs and buildings identifying SCAD. Our tour guide explained that the acronym stood for the School of Creative Arts and Design. This campus seemed to be scattered all over the city. My limited talents kept me from seeking application. The bus stopped at the old railroad station which happened to be the Visitor Center. The

restroom was unisex. That was a first experience. Our guide informed us that Georgia was named after King George II and South Carolina was fostered after King Charles I (Latin: Carolus).

We were bused to Savannah Harbour, which is the largest shipping port on the east coast! All big companies have ware houses in Savannah. The city is actually 20 miles upriver from the Atlantic Ocean. It was founded in 1733 by General James Oglethorpe. Along with 120 passengers, his ship, "Anne" landed at the mouth of the river. He named this last, 13th colony, Georgia. Oglethorpe is credited for laying out the grid for the city streets and multiple city squares before leaving ten years later. Our bus tour included the downtown area and the Victorian District. We witnessed many landscaped "city squares," narrow, one-way streets called carriage lanes, and a few cobblestone-lined streets.

The bus stopped at Columbia Square where a ready-made box lunch was issued. It included a large sandwich, a Byrd Cookie, Leopold's Ice Cream, and cold water. The sugary items were famous products of Savannah. The landscape included several Live Oak trees with many low hanging branches and Spanish Moss.

Of interest to all you confectioners, Savannah was the Flagship store for the Byrd Cookie Company. It was founded in 1924 by Benjamin "Pop" Byrd. The original and still favorite item is the Scotch Oatmeal Cookie. It cost a penny for two initially. The company has stayed in the family for four generations. There are 16 different flavors now with the Key Lime Cooler, a specialty item. This independent company ships their cookies worldwide.

We were informed that Julia Roberts and Tom Hanks have been filmed in roles in Savannah. Tom's scene as Forrest Gump on the park bench was filmed at

Chippewa Square. However the background was a Hollywood movie prop. The actual bench is now a part of a history museum in the city. Hank's daughter was also in the movie and played the part of the girl who wouldn't

let young Forrest sit beside her on the bus. Savannah hosts a 5.5 hour St. Patrick's Day Parade every year. Liberty Ships were built in the harbor during WW II. More later!

Nancy was preceded in death by her parents, husband, son, Randy McCroskey, and grandson, James Holt.

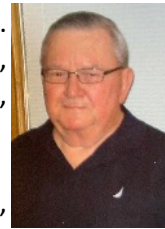
