STATE FFA CONVENTION

Southern Wells FFA Mechanics teams took 1st and 4th place in the state contest held during the Indiana FFA Convention June 13-16. The Junior Division Welding team took 1st place and Southern Wells was awarded Top Chapter Welding Team honors.

Other Career Development Event (CDE) achievements

were the Ag Communication, Mechanics Demonstration, Ag Management Demonstration and Senior Welding Division teams each taking 4th place awards. Ben Shaffer concluded his year as District 6 Treasurer and Sarah Jones was elected District 6 Reporter for the coming year. The Southern Wells Chapter was rated as a Superior Chapter in Indiana based on activities conducted throughout the entire year.

Four members received their State Degree during the Wednesday evening Hoosier Degree award session. Jada Johnson, Breanna Penrod, Sarah Jones and Wyatt Korporal applied for the award last spring and all met requirements for the highest degree to be presented by state FFA associations. The state degree is based on Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE) work records, leadership development, academic achievement, FFA, school and community participation. Each was recognized and presented a certificate and pin significant of the Hoosier Degree.

Ag Mechanics teams competed Monday in the seven hour contest. The top team members were Wyatt Korporal, Ben Shaffer, Vince Drennen and David Schriver.

Placing 4th were Damion Watters, Ace Addington, Abe Herr and Sam Jones. Skills and test topics were agriculture power, welding, plumbing, concrete, electricity, small engines, energy systems and construction.

Each member of each four person team took 5 written tests and demonstrated 5 required skills. As a team they were required to construct a mineral feeder. Contestants had to design a plan, develop a list and bill for materials and construct their feeder in the 55 minute time period. All eight members received scholarships from Ohio Technical College, \$10,000 for first and \$1000 for fourth place.

Taking top honors in the Junior Division (9th and 10th graders) Welding event were Kevin Colon and Jimmy McQueary who placed 1st and 2nd individually. As high individual, Colon was awarded a new welder from Lincoln Electric. Vince Drennen and David Schriver took 4th place in the Senior Division (11th and 12th graders). First place members received \$10,000 and fourth place members a \$1000 scholarship to Ohio Technical College.

MONITOR WILD TURKEYS

The DNR is asking for help from the public to monitor summer production of wild turkeys.

Volunteers will use a web-based survey to record wild turkey sightings during July and August to help provide information about annual turkey reproduction. This online system allows for broader coverage across the state and greater participation from the public.

The surveys provide useful estimates about annual production by hens and the survival of poults through the summer brood-rearing period. Summer brood survival is generally the primary factor influencing wild turkey population trends. Information on summer brood survival is essential for sound turkey management.

Information gathered through the brood survey includes:

- Average brood sizes (total number of hens and total number of poults)
- Percentage of adult hens with poults
- Overall numbers of turkeys seen.
- Participants will be asked to report:
 - Number of turkeys seen and the county the observation was made
 - Sex and relative age (adult or poult) of the birds

· A brood sighting is one in which is one or more hens with poults

· Adult hens without young

· Sightings of gobblers or gobbler groups.
