GRANT **U**PDATE

The Warren Town Council, the fiscal agent for a grant request from the Warren Inc. Knight Bergman Center, has been notified that the grant from the **Energy Efficiency Conservation** Block Grant was not approved.

An attempt, by the Knight-Bergman Center, is being made to secure more information as to why the grant was not approved and what needs to be changed in the grant, prior to another submission of the request for funds.

The grant, if approved, is expected to begin the revamping of the heating system at the Center. This is needed to reduce the extreme heating expenses.

The heating system is the first of three or four large areas needing attention consideration at the Knight-Bergman Center. The Board of Directors are looking at present and future needs of the building. Efforts will continue to be made to secure grant assistance, wherever they might be secured.

Silas Allen Pulse was born July 25, 1842 one half mile from Warren along the Salamonie River. His early years were spent farming with his father and attending school. When the Great Rebellion broke out, he volunteered as a musician. When the order to dispense with bands was issued, he left

the service and returned home. Mr. Pulse worked as a salesman in the mercantile of Good and Brother, in Warren, but in 1863 he again entered military life, enlisting in Company A, Thirteenth Indiana Cavalry. Lieutenant Pulse was named to lead his men, in an operation, to retake a bridge. He placed himself at the head of the men, who, inspired by his fearlessness, sprang forward and succeeded in taking and holding the bridge. Mr. Pulse was discharged November 1865 with the rank of captain.

Back in Warren, Silas purchased the mercantile establishment of S.L. Good. He added more inventory and soon moved the wood building to the west and built the brick building we call the Pulse Block. Mr. Pulse had many other interests, including over eight hundred acres of valuable land. Six hundred acres was a single farm in Wells County. Upon this land,

there were a number of oil wells, the royalties from which were highly compensated, which amounted at one time to about one thousand dollars a month. He also had a lot of livestock.

Writing about Mr. Pulse would be incomplete without mentioning his home. This home was located on the lot next to Markle Medical Center. The house was one of the most beautiful, accessible and complete residences in the county. The original building, a brick structure, was erected by his father, John Pulse in 1861. Silas remodeled, enlarged and supplied the house with all of the modern improvements which make living among men of wealth, in those days, a luxury indeed. The structure was surrounded by a natural grove of beautiful and graceful trees which presented a most luxurious and home-like appearance.


