WHAT IS A PROFESSIONAL PET SITTER?

The other day a lady walked up to me and asked, "What is a professional Pet Sitter?" And then I thought for a minute or two and replied, "A professional Pet Sitter is someone who has completed a six to eight week basic course, like I did at Ivy Tech, and has received a certificate." She then replied, "Go on, tell me more." "Well," I said, "since my instructor,

Veterinarian Jeff Grognet, was focused on teaching basic 'cat and dog' care we were trained in subjects like 'how to take their temperatures, pulse rates, respiratory rate, color of the gums and even hydration levels.' We were also introduced to basic CPR/Pet first aid classes and giving shots if needed. Even though I am not a veterinarian, I was taught how to recognize health problems such as lameness, skin disorders, ear problems, and elimination issues in both cats and dogs. Reason for this, he explained to his students is to gain a thorough understanding of what to do in case of an emergency for the family's pets.

The lady then looked at me and asked this question? "Then what does a Pet Sitter do?" "How is it different than a boarding kennel?" I replied, "Pet sitters can give a family pet their familiar surroundings. They can provide personal care if needed. They can walk the dog and play with the cat. It gives them more of a chance to observe them better. For instance, if a sitter has a client that has arthritis or even a heart condition its better to keep the pet controlled and quiet at home. Those kinds of pets may have to have medication twice a day even. A kennel may be too stressful for these kinds of pets. However, boarding kennels can give younger dogs the opportunity for structured playtime with other dogs, but then too, can't measure up to one on one care a professional pet sitter supplies. Then there are "doggy day care centers" that also offer services for owners who work during the day. But while some dogs have a ball at these places, they're not the best solution for timid, frail, or elderly dogs."

Pet sitters are also trained in

other fields as well. If a client goes on vacation for instance, the client may ask the pet sitter to bring in the mail, open and close curtains, turn on the lights to make the house look lived in. Crime deterrence is a reason why the client doesn't want to use a kennel. They don't want their house looking empty while they are away. Then too, there are the "extra" duties. Putting out the garbage and bringing back the cans, letting in repairmen or people that are supposed to be there, watering plants, and even staying overnight at times.

The lady then looked at me with a surprised look in her eyes and walked away. Not saying a word, but a gentle smile on her face. Her little doggie was in good hands.

I want to thank Treva for filling

in for me and she did a great job and she didn't pick on me as I am always doing to her. (she is such a good sport) I think I will give her the guest spot more often. It has been over 6 years that I was talked into writing this column and I thought who would want to read my silly thoughts now I am sort of running short of ideas. Today for lunch we had baked spaghetti and a salad and will share the salad and dressing I used.

I used, naturally, the bib lettuce from the garden torn in pieces and arranged on it

drained chunk pineapple (which I had fresh pineapple) dried cranberries, kiwi peeled and sliced, mandarin oranges and a few chopped pecans. The dressing was 1/2 cup sugar 1 teaspoon celery seed 1/3 cup white vinegar 1/2 teaspoon paprika 1 tablespoon dried onion bits or fresh onion diced fine 1 cup oil. Mix together all except the oil in a blender and on a medium high speed blend for about a minute reduce the speed to low and slowly add oil. Add sparingly over the salad greens.
