Fire Department – Poulson as Fire Chief

A Truck Committee has been formed to search for a Tanker Truck. The current truck is deteriorating (rust) and developing safety issues. Estimated cost of Tanker with pump is \$150,000. Salamonie Township and the Town share equal cost in Fire Department costs and operation. Council concurred but cited that the Department would need to be aware that purchase of the Tanker would set back purchase of a pumper by a number of years. The Town's projected share of the proposed Tanker cost would be paid out of a cumulative fund which contains monies accumulated such purchases.

Discussion returned to the Blower Replacement project at the WWTP. Glessner moved, seconded by Buzzard to approve the following:


Engineers Contract for the Project - \$18,400






