By the way, I wouldn't dare turn on the light, because then I would wake up all the way and I would never be able to get back to sleep. CLEAN UP DAYS

Fall Cleanup Week for Town of Warren residents is scheduled for Monday, October 7th through Saturday Noon, October 12th. The dumpsters will be located at the Utility Garage at 316 W Second and will be available daily from 8:00 am through 4:15 pm and on Saturday, 8:00 am until noon. Items not accepted include toxic waste, tires, appliances with Freon, electronics, building material such as concrete (Any items not accepted at the Land Fill). Please respect this service by not placing any of

those items in the containers. In addition, this service is for Town of Warren residents only.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Town of Warren Water Department is planning to flush hydrants on Monday, September 30th and Tuesday and Wednesday, October 1st and 2nd. As a user, you may experience a short time of lower pressure than usual. Also, please run faucets before using water to clear any discoloration, especially prior to doing laundry. However, the water is safe for use. Again, both of these situations will be of short duration. Be aware that if contractors arrive to work on the well system at Tower Park, the flushing will be delayed but should be completed within that week.

BILL PAYMENT

A new system for automatic payment of utility bills will be offered beginning in October with PNC Bank providing the clearing system through an encrypted and secure method. An account at ANY bank may be used for payment and the Bank does not have to have a local branch. An authorization form available at Town Hall or on the website at warrenindiana.us must be filed at Town Hall by the 5th of the month that the automatic payment is to begin. The system being installed will then set up

automatic payments on the 10th of every month. A debit to the account being used will show payment to the Town of Warren within the next few days after the automatic withdrawal. Instead of receiving a receipt following the transaction, the utility customer will receive the utility bill on the 1st of every month indicating that automatic payment will be made on the 10th. Please call the office with any questions, 375-2656.

An online system of paying by credit card is also being installed and will not assess a charge to the user. The utility customer must have utility account number(s) and the payment amount available as that information will not be available on the site. It is expected that the system will be available by the second week in October so continue to check the Warren Weekly, the website at warrenindiana.us, or Warren Cable TV Channel 8 for further information.
