





Three calls were made to the BBB regarding door-to-door sales in the Fort Wayne area.

The Better Business Bureau of Northeastern Indiana received a call from a consumer in the Fort Wayne area regarding a young man who appeared at his door selling magazine subscriptions for Readers Across America.

Readers Across America is located in Denver, CO and has an unsatisfactory record with the Denver BBB. They have had 173 complaints filed against them, and 117 of those complaints involved consumers not receiving the magazine subscription order. Other complaints filed were refund issues, customer service issues, sales issues, and credit or billing issues.

A third incidence involved a consumer who called in for information about Hy-Pro Chemical Corp. who also sells household cleaners door-to-door.
