### HARVEST SEASON

Harvest season is here and for some that means visiting pumpkin patches and apple orchards, but we want to remind motorists that harvest season also means farmers will begin harvesting this year's corn and soybean crops. That means more slow-moving agricultural equipment will be traveling on Indiana's rural roads and highways. We want to remind everyone to stay alert and be courteous to ensure we all get home safely.

"Fall is one of my favorite seasons of the year, and I know for many others it's their favorite, too. While traveling along our rural roads I often come across tractors, grain wagons and combines traveling between fields to harvest their crops," said Lt. Gov. Suzanne Crouch. "I want to encourage all motorists to slow down, be patient and be on high alert for agricultural equipment on our roads this harvest season."

In 2019 in Indiana, farm equipment vehicles (other than trucks) were involved in three accidents, with one fatality, according to the National Highway Traffic Administration.

"Harvest season is a busy time for both farmers and motorists, I want to remind everyone to slow down and be courteous on our rural roads and highways," said Bruce Kettler, director of the

Indiana State Department of Agriculture. "Slow moving farm equipment typically travels at 25 miles per hour or less, so be sure to exercise caution when approaching."

Farm equipment during harvest season could include tractors, combines, grain carts, grain wagons and large trucks hauling agricultural products. These vehicles are wide, sometimes taking up most of the road, and often travel at speeds no greater than 25 mph.

The following list includes several safety tips for motorists approaching large farm equipment:

\* Farmers will pull over when they are able to let motorists pass, but it may take time for them to get to a safe place to do so.

\* Be patient. Farm equipment is wide, sometimes taking up most of the road.

\* Be careful when passing. Do not pass in a designated "No Passing Zone" or within 100 feet of any intersection, railroad grade crossing, bridge, elevation structure or tunnel.

\* Do not try to pass a slow-moving vehicle on the left without ensuring that the vehicle is not planning a left turn. It may appear that the driver is pulling over for you to pass when it is actually preparing to turn. You will drive right into its path, endangering yourself and the farmer.

\* Avoid tailgating, as some farm equipment might have to make sudden stops along the road.

\* Allow plenty of time to get to a destination, be aware of alternate routes and avoid distractions.

"Despite encouraging motorists and farmers alike to take extra precaution on roadways during harvest season, crashes still occur every year," said Doug Carter,

Indiana State Police Superintendent. "One death is one too many. I want to remind everyone to remain alert and exercise caution as you travel on Indiana's rural roads this fall."

**PLAN AHEAD BEFORE JOINING THE "GREAT RESIGNATION"**

It's been called the "Great Resignation" – the large number of Americans voluntarily leaving their jobs. If you plan to be part of it (ideally with another source of employment lined up), you'll need to make the financial moves necessary to keep making progress toward your long-term goals.

Here's some background: After a year in which the pandemic caused so many people to lose their jobs, the economy is opening back up, but the "quit rate" – the number of jobs people have voluntarily left – has been breaking records. Some economists say this high quit rate is because people are confident of getting better jobs, with higher pay and more flexibility to work at home, or because they are preparing to start their own business or join the gig economy.

If you're thinking of joining this temporary migration from the workforce, how can you help ensure that you'll be financially stable and can continue to make progress toward your long-term goals?

Your first move is to look clearly at your financial situation. As mentioned above, it's best to have new employment in hand before you quit your job. Alternatively, perhaps you have a spouse or life partner who earns enough to sustain the two of you, or you've built up an emergency fund that gives you a cushion.

However, if your short-term income is less than you previously earned or you need to go without a paycheck for a while, could you still pay your bills? If you are strapped for cash, you might be tempted to tap into your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. But this move will generally result in taxes and, if you are younger than 59 1/2, a 10 percent penalty as well. Because of this, and because your retirement accounts are designed to be a financial resource after you retire, think twice before dipping into these funds if you leave your current employer.

If your employer allows it, you can leave your money in the 401(k) so you'll still be accumulating resources for retirement. You also have the option to roll those funds into an individual retirement account (IRA) or a new employer's retirement plan.

And if you plan to work for yourself as a freelancer, consultant or business owner, you'll still want to save toward retirement. Possible retirement plans for the self-employed include an "owner-only" 401(k), a SEP-IRA or a SIMPLE IRA, all of which may be relatively easy to establish and offer tax benefits. A financial advisor can help you find a retirement plan that's appropriate for your needs.

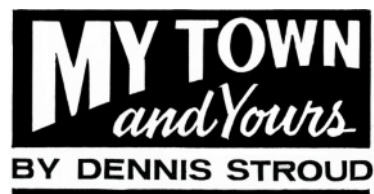

**PHONES BACK THEN**

Back when I was growing up in Warren, Indiana, when you picked up the telephone, we did not hear a dial tone, we heard a voice saying, "number please". Warren citizens expected the town operators to do everything. Besides connecting to some 1300 exchanges by memory, the operators gave the time, made wake-up calls, summoned the police, firemen, doctors and relatives when there was an emergency and they were, also, company for the lonely.

One of the operators was Ella Blair. She started as night operator in 1914 and retired 59 years later. When you wanted to make a call, you picked up your phone, this activated a small light on the switch board. The operator would pick up the cable with a plug on the end and insert the plug, under the light, and then say, "number please."

Young people would have preferred "high tech" dial phones, but there were some advantages. I remember when I was in the

service, stationed at Fort Knox, Kentucky, it was a chore calling home. I only had 3 numbers and it was a ring down from Marion, so I tried to call the same time so I would get the same operator in Marion. One night I got through to the Warren operator, gave her my number, and Ella Blair told me she spoke to my mother in the afternoon, and she was going to my grandmothers tonight, so she would ring out there. That was great because I got to talk to both.

I am sure everybody can remember their number back then and would have some memories of Mrs. Blair and other Warren operators. The citizens of Warren found a lot of comfort in knowing there was someone with sound judgement at the other end of the line.

**A MISSISSIPPI RIVER BOAT TRIP DAY 2, PART 3**

Motoring upstream on the Mississippi River, the boat passed Fulton, IL where a Dutch community was established in the 1800s. A very large windmill was a fixture on the east bank. We immediately entered the # 13 Lock and Dam system on the river. Our craft was raised 10 feet to match the water level north of the dam.

No personal, altitude sickness symptoms were apparent!

The captain maneuvered the boat past Pelican Island which was heavily populated by these white, web-footed birds and their distensible gular pouch. These feathered vertebrates raise their young in this location before flying south for the

winter; sometimes as far south as Peru, South America.

Also abundant were sea gulls and Double-crested Cormorants. These latter, black birds have the ability to dive to 50 feet. They have trouble finding any place on this river to demonstrate that feat! Cormorants have deteriorated some of the vegetation.

Trees were tall and bountiful on the banks as well as Lilly Pads near the shore. The latter disappeared in 1980 due to river pollution. The river was nearly void of debris now. The boat captain informed the passengers that during early water traveling, waving only one hand to a passing boat's crew meant that there might be a gun in the other hand. Some shootings occurred to discourage or delay the other ship from being first in line for stopping and loading riverside firewood for their steam engines. Waving both

hands was a non-combative greeting.

Our boat, the Twilight navigated Lock & Dam # 12 at 2:30 pm. The other passenger boat, that left LeClaire ahead of us and was passed by our cruiser, caught up and was allowed to enter the locks first. Landscape and water kept rising as northward travel continued.

By 3:40, we were 18 miles from our overnight destination in Dubuque, IA.

Captain announced, upon passing the site of "Dead Man's Slew," that in 1941 a sudden drop in temperature resulted in a horrific snow storm that trapped hunters who were ill-equipped for the change in weather. The news worthy event was overshadowed by the Pearl Harbor attack.

After an onboard dinner of Huckleberry (Finn) Chicken, we arrived at 6 pm. in Dubuque. Grand Harbor Resort on the waterfront was welcomed. More later.

**COLLEGE APPLICATION WEEK**

Fourteen Indiana colleges will waive college application fees during Indiana's College Application Week, September 20-24,

according to the Indiana Commission for Higher Education. Another 25 colleges have reported free applications year-round.

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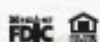
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
